DAILY HOME LEARNING (Highly recommended)

1. Taking home your reading book daily and reading with an adult and independently every day. This needs to be recorded in the reading record and signed by an adult.
2. Taking home your spelling activities to practise ready for the school test.
3. Practise your multiplication tables up to 12x12 and the inverse. Please note, knowing times tables is a requirement of the National Curriculum. Therefore, it is imperative that these are learnt, so they can be used every day in Maths lessons.
4. Software programmes – ‘Hit the Button’, ‘Top Maths’ and ‘Spellzone’

ACTIVITIES (Work to be supported by an adult if required)

The following are home learning which we would encourage your child to do at home. All home learning is to be brought to school on the following days.

1. One piece of English work per week, set on a Friday, which is to be returned on the following Wednesday.
2. One piece of Maths per week, set on a Friday, which is to be returned on the following Thursday.
3. Topic work – Personal Study encourages enhancing work taking place in the class.
